

Being a pet owner also brings responsibilities. Isaac Regional Council is here to help guide you through your legal requirements.

- ☐ **Registration -** All dogs MUST be registered with Council from 12 weeks of age. Registration is due annually.
- ☐ Microchipping All dogs MUST be microchipped from 12 weeks of age. This can be arranged through your local vet. A microchip is an implanted chip that stores the dog's (and owner's) details on a national data base. This is not the same as having your dog registered with Council.
- ☐ **De-sexing -** This is highly recommended to avoid unwanted animals and can be done from 6 months of age through your local vet. De-sexed dogs also receive reduced registration fees with Council.
- ☐ **Vaccinations** Highly recommended to keep your dog healthy. They will live longer, healthier lives with reduced likelihood of illnesses.
- ☐ **Identification -** Recommended to be attached to your dog's collar with their name and your contact details.
- □ **Number of dogs allowed -** A maximum of two dogs for a standard house and one dog for a multi-dwelling such as townhouses.
- ☐ **Impoundment -** The fee for each and every impoundment, regardless of the length of captivity, is as per Council's Annual Schedule of Fees and Charges.
- ☐ **Enclosure -** Enclosures must be secure and an acceptable size in relation to the animal being housed. They must be kept clean and sanitary with food scraps

- collected daily. Waste and waste water from the enclosure must not impact on adjoining premises.
- ☐ **Keeping of greyhounds -** Greyhound owners must ensure that dogs are kept without nuisance, and a code of practice has been approved by the Greyhound Racing Authority of QLD in accordance with these requirements.
- ☐ **Breeding dogs -** In Queensland, if you breed a dog on or after 26 May 2017 you must be registered as a breeder - even if your dog has an unplanned litter or you only breed puppies for family and friends (primary producers breeding working dogs are exempt). To register as a breeder, visit gdbr.daf.gld.gov.au online for the Queensland Dog Breeder Register.
- □ **Dogs on heat -** Owners must ensure their dog is NOT in a public place during this time.
- □ **Dogs defecating in a public place -** The person who has control of the dog must immediately remove and dispose of waste in a sanitary way.
- ☐ **Wandering dogs -** The owner or person responsible must ensure that the dog does not wander at large from their property.
- ☐ Barking Nuisance The person responsible for the dog must take all reasonable measures to prevent the animal from making a disturbance or noise causing a nuisance to occupants of adjoining premises or in the vicinity of which the animal is kept.
