In relation to six councillors the OIA decided to take no further action pursuant to section 150Y(b)(i) of the Local Government Act 2009 [the Act].	On the basis that, following an investigation, there was no evidence to raise a reasonable suspicion of inappropriate conduct or misconduct. In relation to the remaining three councillors the OIA decided to take no further action pursuant to section 150Y(b)(iii) of the Act on the basis that, following an investigation, taking further action would be an unjustifiable use of resources given the information obtained by the OIA.	15/05/2020
10/07/2020	It was alleged that a Councillor may have misused information provided to them as a Councillor, about the procurement of signage for two Council projects 'Isaac Computer Choir' and 'Shop Isaac'.	The OIA decided to take no further action pursuant to section 150Y(b)(i) of the Local Government Act 2009 [the Act].	On the basis that the conduct does not raise a reasonable suspicion of inappropriate conduct or misconduct. An investigation determined that the information in question was publicly available and the Councillor had in fact received the information from a third party who was a member of the community.	3/02/2021
