OBJECTIVE

This policy provides the framework for the purpose of the construction of the Moranbah Miners Memorial and responsibilities for the future maintenance and management of the Memorial.

SCOPE

This policy applies to the Moranbah Miners Memorial monument (Memorial) that is located in Moranbah's Town square, this policy gives guidance to;

- The ownership and responsibility for maintaining the Memorial
- The criteria and process for a mining fatality to be added to the Memorial
- The appearance of any maintenance, upgrades or additional plaques on the Memorial
- The list of Mine sites eligible for recognition on the Memorial

POLICY STATEMENT

IRC in collaboration with local union organisations (funding partners) developed and constructed a Moranbah Miners Memorial to recognise mining fatalities that occurred in the Moranbah region. This Policy aims to give guidance to the purpose of the construction and ongoing facilitation of the Memorial for the Moranbah Community.

OWNERSHIP OF THE MEMORIAL ASSET

The Memorial was developed and constructed with financial support from a number of local union membership groups (funding partners), however IRC retains full ownership of the asset. IRC will be responsible to maintain the asset and is responsible/liable for all damage, repairs and replacement requirements. IRC reserves the right to make any modifications to the Memorial it deems necessary, whilst undertaking engagement and consultation with respect to the original funding partners and other relevant stakeholders including community.

MEMORIAL SERVICE GROUP DEVELOPMENT

IRC supports the development of a standalone responsible group primarily consisting of the original funding partners of the Moranbah Miners Memorial to facilitate any annual or related miners memorial day events and if appropriate, recommend to IRC any inclusions for remembrance. It would be requested that IRC have equal membership on this proposed group, with equal voting rights as the other founding members. IRC will assist in the development of the Terms of Reference to guide the governance, should a group wish to be established.

CRITERIA OF MINING FATALITY FOR THE MORANBAH MEMORIAL

The initial criteria for a mining fatality name that will appear on the Moranbah Miners Memorial shall be as follows;

1. A mining facility that occurs as per the Department of Natural Resources Mines Energy definition being;
 - a. A mining fatality is classified as a serious accident under section 16(a) of the Coal Mining Safety and Health Act 1999:
 - b. A serious accident at a coal mine is an accident at a coal mine that causes the death of a person;

Note: While SSEs are required to report all deaths to a Mines Inspector and an Industry Safety and Health Representative (ISHR) under section 198 of the Coal Mining Safety and Health Act 1999, if the death is a natural death there are no further reporting requirements under the mining legislation. Natural deaths are investigated by the Queensland Police Service and not deemed a mining fatality as per the above definition "serious accident".

2. It is proposed that at the discretion of the proposed Memorial Service group (made up of funding partners) a fatality that occurs in extenuating circumstances outside the definition listed above, may

be reviewed and on request to IRC, that fatality name will be acknowledged on the Moranbah Miners Memorial

3. Any fatality name to be listed on the memorial will seek approval of that fatalities next of kin for the name plaque to be placed on the Memorial.

APPEARANCE OF THE NAMES PLAQUE

Fatality name plaques will have the following characteristics;

- Name of the deceased person
- Date of Decease
- Name of Mine
- Size – 380mm H x 500mm L
- Material - Bronze
- Border SBD15 – Scalloped outline
- Colour – Light Brown
- Surface - Stipple
- Fonts – Times New Roman – 28px, times New Roman – 20px
- Fixing system – 1 x lugs with studs
- Draft appearance (below)



MORANBAH MINING SITES LOCATIONS

The following Mine sites were identified with the original funding partners as the list of mines wherein a mining fatality occurs as per the criteria above, will appear on the Moranbah Miners Memorial.

1. Peak Downs Mine
2. Eagle Downs Mine
3. Daunia Mine
4. Grosvenor Mine
5. Moranbah North Mine
6. Broadmeadow Mine
7. Goonyella Riverside Mine (previously Goonyella Mine & Riverside Mine)

8. Isaac Plains Mine
9. Moorvale Mine
10. Millennium Mine
11. Poitrel Mine
12. Carborough Downs Mine
13. Caval Ridge Mine
14. North Goonyella Mine

The above list may be expanded on application/request as new resource projects and developments occur or should circumstances require amendment. Applications/requests to amend Councils Policy from the proposed committee must be made in writing to the Chief Executive Officer of IRC.
